DAY BY DAY with Father Pat
(Week of December 27 2009)

Mon Dec. 28 - I was called to do a funeral Mass at St. Mary's in Bath a few days ago, as Fr. Jim Jaeger there had to be away. It turned out the deceased had roots in Bradford and St. Stanislaus Church. She was Catherine (Kate) Bocek. It was also a privilege to celebrate Mass there, as I used to attend Mass there as a young boy when we spent part of the summer with my grandmother in Avoca. The church has been renovated since those days, but still retains its prayerful, peaceful influence. I was especially impressed by eight large Tiffany glass(?) angels hanging from the ceiling lights. It created a festive look. The parish volunteers who were servers and singers also helped to create a wonderful liturgy.

Tues Dec 29 - it was my turn to have charge of providing food for our monthly gathering of the Steuben priests and pastoral administrators. We always meet at St. Mary's in Bath, but rotate responsibilities for bringing the food. I brought too much, so after our meeting divided it up for folks to take.

Wed Dec 30 - had lunch with a friend, and did some errands. This was my day off, so I did not plan a whole lot.

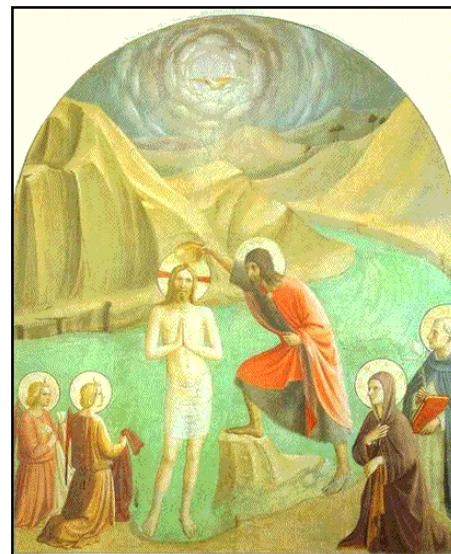

This evening, a warning sign came up on my dashboard, indicating to change my oil, get a new oil filter, and another icon that said 'exit'! I normally get an oil change every three thousand miles, but never had the car tell me to do it. I was afraid the car would shut down or something, and everyplace would be closed until next Monday. I will just have to live with it until I can get it taken care of Monday.

Jan 1, 2010 - Happy New Year!! We Catholics celebrated the New Year with Mass, since today is the holyday of Mary, the Mother of God. It is also the Word Day of Prayer for Peace. After the 12:15pm Mass I stopped up to see Dad.

Sat Jan 2 - first thing this morning I gathered with the Secular Franciscan group in Painted Post for their Crib service, a devotion in honor of St. Francis of Assisi, who tradition says created the first manger scene. Then I went to St. Mary's in Corning to concelebrate the funeral Mass for Fr. Neil Miller, who is a native of Corning. Fr. Ed Golden, a classmate, presided. Both Fr.

Miller and Fr. Golden were ordained at this church where Fr. Miller said his First Mass, and now is being buried from. It was a nice tribute to a great man and wonderful priest. May he rest in peace. Afterward I attended a Graduation luncheon for Rachel Ketchum at Bernie Murray's in Elmira (Southside). It was a nice tribute to her hard work. Then I went on a Communion Call, and it was time for the 5:15 pm Mass.
